South is declarer in 5♣. West leads ♥ K.

1 **♥**K,A,7,2 2 **♥**3,8,**♣**3,**♥**10 revoke 3 **♣**5,Q,A,6 4 **♥**4,9,**♣**9,**♥** revoke

South now plays 4 more rounds of trumps and west doesn't know it but still is squeezed in ♥/♦. South manages to win all 13 tricks, but has to show his ♥6 for that. Now his revoke becomes clear. What decision to make?

South plays 3NT. West starts with $\clubsuit 9$, east plays $\spadesuit 2$. South plays to $\blacktriangledown A$ and continues with $\blacktriangledown K$ on which west revokes. South cashes the $\blacktriangledown Q$ and west revokes again. Then $\spadesuit 8$ for the $\spadesuit J$ in west. Then $\spadesuit K$ for south's Ace and south leads $\spadesuit 10$ for easts' Q. Club to the Q and another trick for the $\clubsuit A$. South is 1 off. Now the double revoke by west becomes apparent. TD.

South is declarer in 4 ... West starts with 4 ... and east returns a spade, won in dummy. From north 4 ... for west who continues diamonds ruffed in dummy on which south discards 4 ... (revoke). A club from dummy for Q and K and west plays another diamond. North a small 4 ... and ruffed by south (second revoke). Now south plays one round of trumps, in North a small 4 ... A heart finessed, a club ruff, a heart to the ace and two free clubs in dummy for an astonishing 10 tricks.
