If you want to relax with a book the recently published *The Dream of the Celt* by Mario Vargas Llosa (Faber & Faber £18.99) is set in the summer of 1916 when Dublin lies in ruins after the Easter Rising; the rebel Sir Roger Casement awaits his death in London's Pentonville Prison.

To whet your appetite today's performances include:

12:00 King Lear and Macbeth - Main Green, St Stephen's Green

Directed by Mark Doyle

The half-delirious King Lear wanders on a desolate heath during a storm, raging against his ungrateful daughters.

Macbeth is astounded when he discovers that the witches and their fiendish masters have tricked him with their ambiguous predictions.

Dublin's literary history is brought to life by the Wonderland Theatre (www.wonderlandtheatre.com) In 1914 the epiphany that awoke the world's imagination to the battered yet tumultuous city of Dublin, her streets, and her people, was a modest book of short stories that would become a defining Irish classic, James Joyce'sDubliners.

Wonderland Productions' Dubliners is a self-guided audio-walking tour on headphones that invites you to tour the streets and historic buildings in which Joyce set his classic stories, whilst you listen to his stories in situ, as they are told and performed for you on headphones by a large ensemble cast led by the celebrated Joycean actor Barry McGovern.
